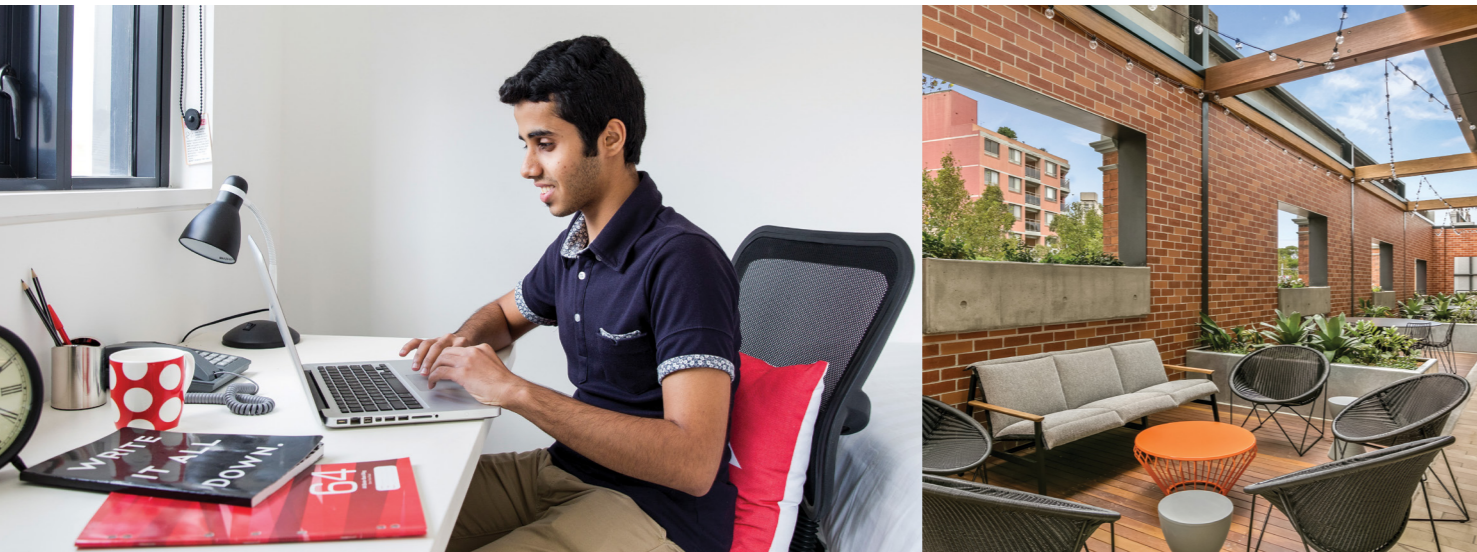

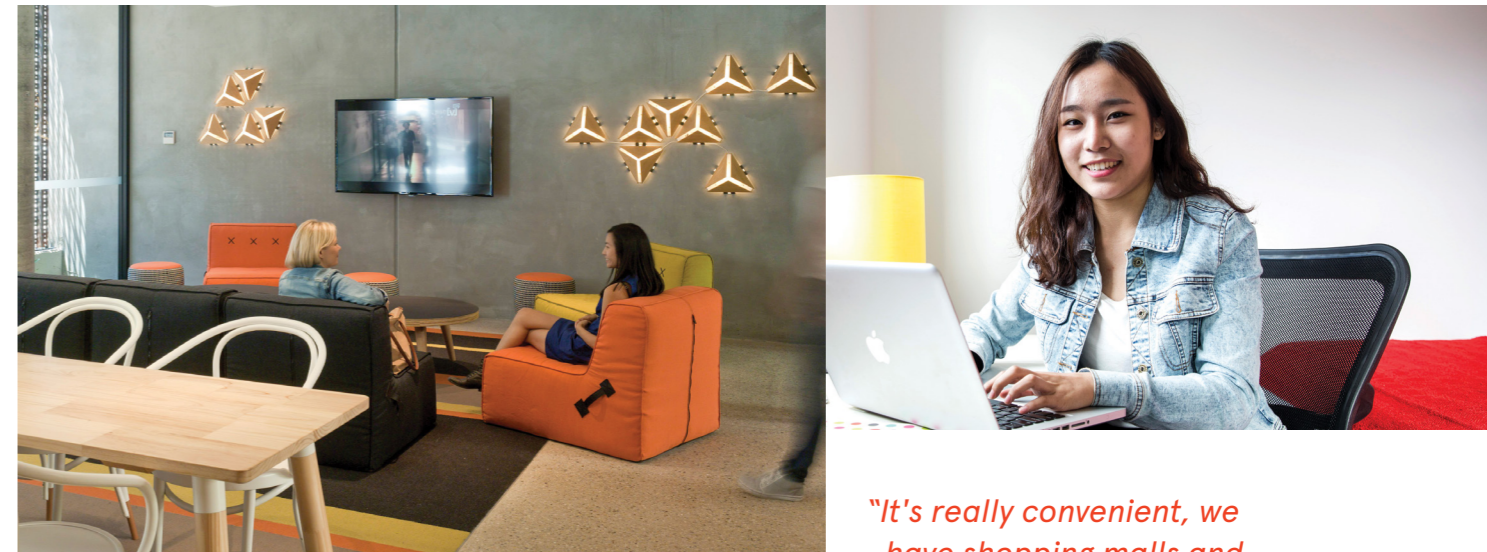

High Achievers Preparation Program (HAPP)

Our accelerated program, offering preparation to students with higher grades, can be the gateway to the University of Sydney degree of your choice.

The High Achievers Preparation Program (CRICOS 089556F) is designed for international students who have just missed out on direct entry to the University of Sydney. It is a fast-tracked program, which is a maximum of 14 weeks. HAPP will help you transition from high school to university study.

HAPP is a competency-based pathway to a bachelor's degree at the University of Sydney.

Progression to a bachelor's degree at the University of Sydney is based on successfully meeting the requirements of your chosen university degree.

You will study English and Uniprep, plus a choice of two of the following: Australian History, Sociology, Science Practicum and Advanced Mathematics.

Our Foundation Program's Standard and Intensive formats are offered for students who need a relative amount of preparation ahead of taking on a degree at the University of Sydney. They are taught full time over the course of 52 and 40 weeks, respectively.

- Academic English and Social Research and Inquiry are compulsory core modules for all students.
- Some degrees have a compulsory mathematics prerequisite.

HAPP High Achievers Preparation Program



More about the subjects

Our accelerated program is taught full time over 14 weeks, preparing you for your chosen degree at the University of Sydney.

When studying this program, you will follow these steps:

- 1 Choose two compulsory subjects, as well as two additional subjects.
- 2 Check the University's assumed knowledge to ensure you have the right level of knowledge in the relevant subject areas before you commence your university degree.
- 3 The program is competency based and the available university degree depends on your entry grades.
- 4 Upon successful completion of the HAPP program, and meeting the University of Sydney English language requirements and any additional admission criteria that may apply, you can progress to the degree you wish to study at the University of Sydney.

Assessment methods

There is no final examination for HAPP as it is competency-based. Assessment of competencies is based on written and class activities linked to individual competencies including written and oral responses, quizzes and research projects.

Award

On completion, a Certificate of Completion is issued.

AEP (CRICOS 085947A), offered by Navitas Australia trading as Taylors College, is not a University of Sydney program
