


Please note: All students travelling without an approved guardian must live in University approved accommodation and book an approved airport transfer service.


All homestay providers are approved to provide airport transfer services. Students who require airport transfer services must book directly with the provider.

Programs University of Sydney Foundation Program (USFP)

Offered in three formats - Standard, Extended and Intensive - to meet a variety of students' needs, our USFP provides the skills you need to study an undergraduate degree at Australia's first university.

USFP Standard Program (CRICOS 022310D) is taught over two semesters. with two 10-week terms each semester. You will study 10 subjects in total. five subjects in each semester made up of Academic English Skills and four academic subjects. You study the same subject for the full semester.

USFP Extended Program (CRICOS 048302A) is taught over three semesters, with two 10-week terms each semester. You will study 12 subjects in total, four subjects in each semester. The same subject is studied for the full semester.

USFP Intensive Program (CRICOS 036126M) is taught over 1.5 semesters, made up of three 10-week terms. You will study 10 subjects in total over the 1.5 semesters. In your first term, you study Academic English Skills and three academic subjects. In your final semester, you study Academic English Skills and five academic subjects. The same subject is studied for the full semester.

Working with the University

The University of Sydney oversees the setting and moderating of final examinations, and staff from the University also often visit Taylors College Sydney, giving you the opportunity to find out more about your course options.

The High Achievers Preparation Program (CRICOS 089556F) is designed for international students who have just missed out on direct entry to the University of Sydney. It is a fast-tracked program, which is a maximum of 14 weeks. HAPP will help you transition from high school to university study.

HAPP is a competency-based pathway to a bachelor's degree at the University of Sydney.

Progression to a bachelor's degree at the University of Sydney is based on successfully meeting the requirements of your chosen university degree.

You will study English and Uniprep, plus a choice of two of the following: Australian History, Sociology, Science Practicum and Advanced Mathematics.

Course structures **USFP Standard and Intensive Program**



More about the subjects

Our Foundation Program's Standard and Intensive formats are offered for students who need a relative amount of preparation ahead of taking on a degree at Sydney. They are taught full time over the course of 52 and 40 weeks, respectively.

Course structure overview**

- A total of 10 different subjects is required to graduate Academic English Skills (2), plus 8 academic subjects.
- Typically, you study A subjects in your first semester and B subjects in your final semester. This does not mean that the A subjects are a prerequisite for B subjects. For some subjects, you could study the B subject before the A subject.
- The academic subjects are studied as majors and minors. A major is when you study both the A and B in a subject. A minor is when you study only the A or only the B of a subject.
- You must study at least 3 majors and can then choose either 2 minors or a 4th major to make up your 8 academic subjects.

Course structures **USFP Extended Program**

Aimed at students who need slightly longer to prepare, this extended format of our foundation program is taught full time over the course of 75 weeks.

The program is tailored to meet your needs and prepare you as much as possible for your degree at the University of Sydney. It is aimed at students requiring a little more support.

Course structure overview

- You will study 12 subjects in total over the 3 semesters, 4 subjects in each semester.
- In your first semester, you study Extended English, Essential Study Skills and two academic subjects. All students must pass Extended English to progress to the next semester of study.
- In your second and third semester, you study Academic English Skills (AES) and 3 academic subjects in each semester.

New Curriculum July 2024

From July 2024 the Taylors College Sydney will be implementing a new Curriculum for Standard, Intensive and Extended Foundation programs. The Curriculum will consist of modules which will enhance student skills across multiple disciplines and align with the University of Sydney graduate attributes. As part of the new curriculum, all students will study the core units of Academic English and Social Research and Inquiry. They will then study 3 further modules from the 11 study modules listed below. These include:

- Biology
- Chemistry
- **Physics**
- **Cultural Studies**
- International and Global Studies

Our accelerated program is taught full time over 14 weeks, preparing you for your chosen degree at the University of Sydney.

When studying this program, you will follow these steps:

- 1 Choose two compulsory subjects, as well as two additional subjects.
- 2 Check the University's assumed knowledge to ensure you have the right level of knowledge in the relevant subject areas before you commence your university degree.
- 3 The program is competency based and the available university degree depends on your entry grades.
- 4 Upon successful completion of the HAPP program, and meeting the University of Sydney English language requirements and any additional admission criteria that may apply, you can progress to the degree you wish to study at the University of Sydney.

Assessment methods

There is no final examination for HAPP as it is competency-based. Assessment of competencies is based on written and class activities linked to individual competencies including written and oral responses, quizzes and research projects.

Award

On completion, a Certificate of Completion is issued.

Academic English Preparation



Academic English Preparation (AEP)

If you need to improve your level of English language skills in order to study a foundation program, AEP is the perfect solution.

AEP (CRICOS 085947A), offered by Navitas Australia trading as Taylors College, is not a University of Sydney program

Designed to help you boost your English language abilities, upon completing this course you should be at a linguistic level with which you can join the University of Sydney Foundation Program (USFP).

No IELTS required on successful completion of the required level of AEP

This means you do not need to take an IELTS test before progressing to your academic foundation program.

In order to progress from the AEP to the USFP, students must achieve an end term score of 60% in all 4 core skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking). Students are also required to attend a minimum of 80% of their classes to complete the course.

Fast, effective progress in speaking, writing, reading and listening

The program focuses on maximising your progress in each of the four core English skills.

Fundamental skills for academic learning

You will develop note taking, essay writing, presentation and summarising skills to help you learn faster and with greater confidence. To help achieve this, modern educational technology is used extensively.

Personal study plan

When you apply, your English competency level will be determined. When you start your course, you will then be classed based on your language proficiency to make sure you start your English course at the right level.

Extension

You may extend your study plan if you do not manage to achieve the required level for your academic foundation program.

Academic support

You will receive academic advice to ensure you make a smooth transition into your USFP program.

Maximise your support

Class sizes are kept small so your progress can be monitored closely.

Regular testing

Your progress will be regularly checked to help ensure you reach your full potential, with reports provided every five weeks.

Delivered on campus

Your AEP lessons will be delivered face-to-face and will consist of 23 tuition hours per week.

Teachers

AEP teaching staff are highly qualified and experienced professionals in the English as a Second Language (ESL) field.

Entry requirements

The minimum entry level for AEP at Taylors College Sydney is an IELTS of 4.0 with no band less than 3.5. However, for students from certain countries, they might be required to have an IELTS of 5.0 with no band less than 4.5 to enrol in a packaged course with AEP and the University of Sydney Foundation Program.

Speak to your agent or your Student Enrolment Advisor to find out about your country-specific entry requirements.

Assessment methods

Four skills (listening, reading, speaking and writing) are assessed with the final grade consisting of both coursework and final exam marks.

Certificate of Completion

Once you have successfully completed and finished the AEP course, you will receive a Certificate of Completion which is issued by Navitas Australia Pty Limited.

Course length

The minimum course length is 10 weeks. There will be a scheduled holiday break with the February, April, July and November intakes of AEP.

How to apply

To be successful, you need to meet the entry criteria for the University of Sydney Preparation program.

The Future Leaders Award will be automatically applied to eligible students and will be reflected in the Taylors College letter of offer.

The University of Sydney Vice-Chancellor's International Scholarships Scheme (VCIS)

This scholarship of up to \$40,000 supports high-achieving international students pursuing coursework studies at the University of Sydney.

The VCIS is a scholarship offered on commencement of a coursework degree and is only awarded once, during the first year of commencement and is not renewable for the following years.
